We are forming a Christ Lutheran Team to participate on Saturday May 17.** Please sign up in the lobby if you want to be a part of our church team at the RELAY. Relay for Life is hosted by the American Cancer Society as a team/community event to fight cancer. The Relay includes games and activities for children, a continuous walk around the track, music, food, and community groups participating together to fight cancer and be a source of hope for those who face cancer. **Sign up by April 6 to be on the Christ Lutheran Team,** so we can get materials to you. We will have a tent for folks from our church at the Relay. Cancer Survivors are welcome to walk in the opening lap around the track in the morning of May 17. A Luminaria Ceremony is held around the track after dark.

You can purchase a luminaria in memory or in honor of someone you know who has faced cancer.
