### **About the ELCA YOUTH GATHERING...**

Thank you for all the support you have given to our older High School Youth who are working to get to New Orleans for the July 2009 ELCA Youth Gathering. 33,000 youth and chaperones are registered now for the Gathering. To appeal for further assistance with costs, our group applied and received over \$1,000 in scholarship monies from the ELCA. We are traveling all night from Ohio to New Orleans by bus with four other ELCA Youth Groups to save on travel costs. The Gathering only happens once every 3 years. The young adults in our congregation, who attended when they were in High School, will tell you that the ELCA Gathering is truly a once-in-a-lifetime event. It is a strong builder of Christian faith, and (especially this year) an extraordinary opportunity to bring an estimated total of 40,000 youth and adult chaperones into the city still reeling from Hurricane Katrina. We hope to be a part of its healing.

Would you keep us all in your prayers as we not only raise funds for the practicality of making this trip, but also work together to focus our attentions on being Christ's people and journeying to the Gathering in his holy name. Please pray for the high school youth attending: Brooke Diller, Rhita Gainer, Abby Holman, Elisa Santiago, Jessica Sullivan, Alec Van Dyke, Dustin Weaver,

Megan, Austin, & Kaitlyn White.

While in New Orleans, they will participate from 8am until 10pm in Bible Studies, Prayer, Worship, Praise Gatherings, Servant-Outreach ministries, and learn about all the ministries going on not only in the ELCA, but among Christians from around the world. They hear the stories of courageous Christians who have persevered in faith even though they faced persecution. They will be enthusiastically encouraged to participate in serving Christ the Lord. They will go into the city neighborhoods to do servant projects. With 40,000 Lutheran Youth in the city all at the same time, they are literally surrounded by Christian youth and adults, pastors and lay persons, bishops and missionaries from around the globe.

They also have some fun each day with optional activities like dances, arts and crafts, Christian music concerts, zip-lines, bungee jumps (hey, it is a YOUTH gathering ☺) and an activity center the size of several football fields full of things to do that all focus on being a Christian youth in today's world. They must stop for the "Final Fifteen" at 11:45 pm each night for prayer and reflection about what they have learned that day. They also stop to pray in the middle of the afternoon. They have the opportunity to worship several times per day with 40,000 Lutherans and also in smaller groups.
